Components of Each Lesson Plan

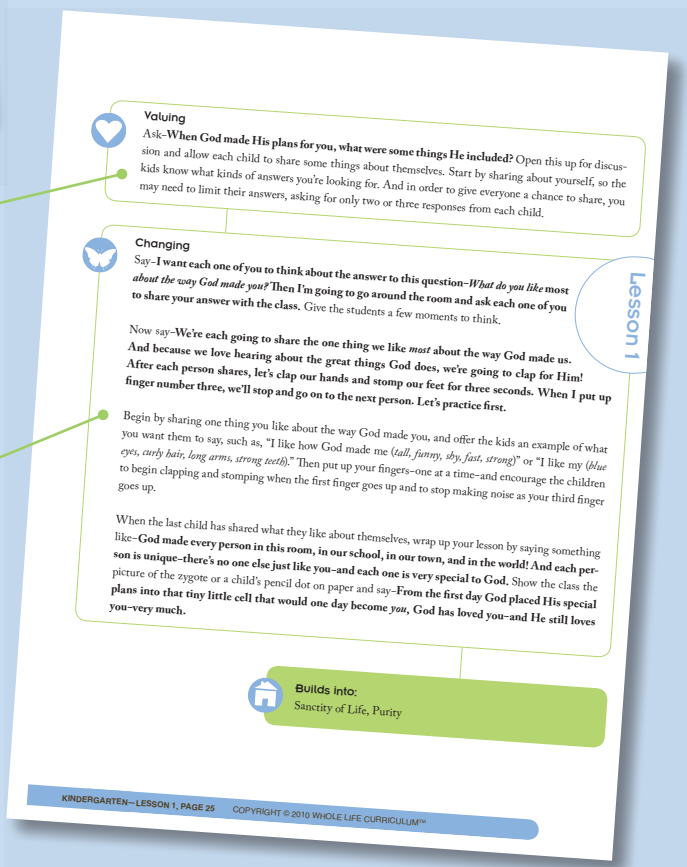


Making an Entrance captures the students' attention and draws them into the lesson in an interactive and personal way.

Informing contains the scriptural basis for the lesson. Students explore the goodness of God's plan for their lives.

Valuing gives students the chance to think about how they can choose to live what they value.

Changing helps students identify something they want to do differently as a result of what they have learned in the lesson.
